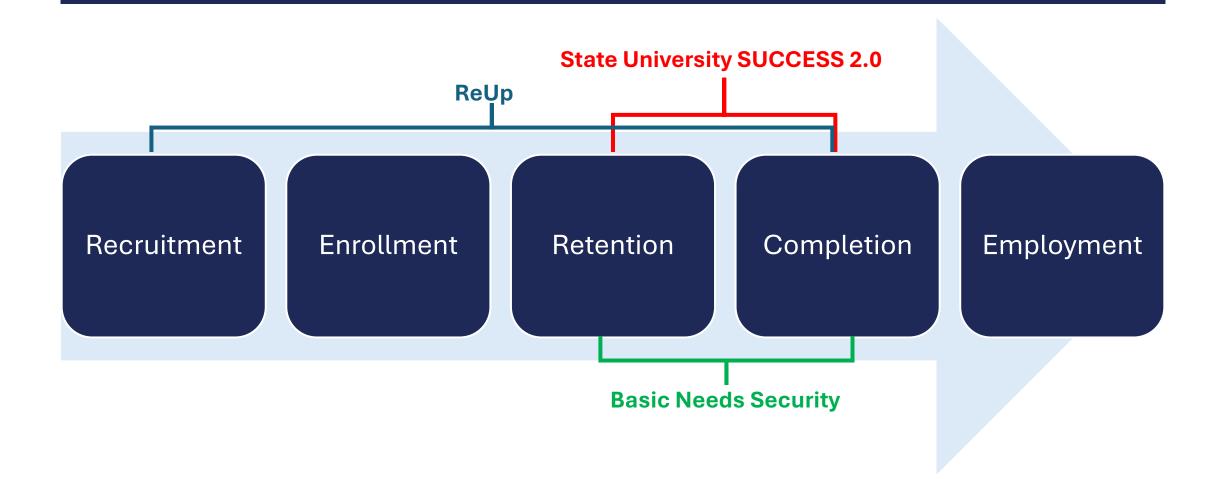

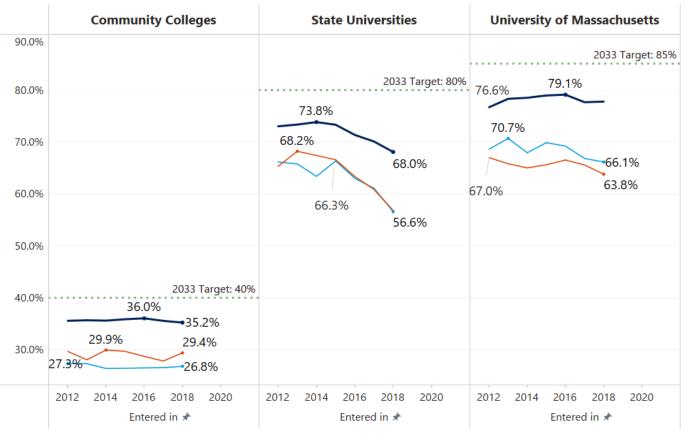

Completion Rates Continues to be a Challenge

Completion Anywhere Rate | Fall 2012–2018 Cohorts



Metric

- Cohort: New first-time and new transfer degreeseeking students each fall (full- and part-time)
- Outcome: Percent who completed a degree or certificate anywhere in the U.S. within six years
- Source: DHE analysis of DHE/HEIRS and National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) data
- Targets set by BHE in June 2023, to be met by 2033

Next Updates

 Early November 2025: Completion rates for the cohort that entered in fall 2019 and completed by 2025

- All students
- Black or African American students
- Hispanic or Latino students

FY26 Legislative Language (1596-2439)

"For state university cohort counseling to ensure student success (SUCCESS) grants to state universities to provide wraparound supports and services to improve outcomes for their most vulnerable populations including, but not limited to, low--income, first--generation, minority and disabled students and lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning students; provided, that funds shall be disbursed based on a formula and criteria developed by the department of higher education; provided further, that eligible wiraparound support activities shall include, but not be limited to, peer mentors, academic skills workshops and targeted academic, career and scholarship advising; provided further, that appropriated funds may be expended for programs or activities during the summer months; provided further, that all funds distributed may be spent solely on personnel costs at the discretion of the universities; and provided further, that not later than March 3, 2026, the department shall report to the house and senate committees on ways and means on the progress made on implementing and funding this program, including any regulations, guidelines or criteria used to distribute the funds and on the final distribution of funds to campuses"

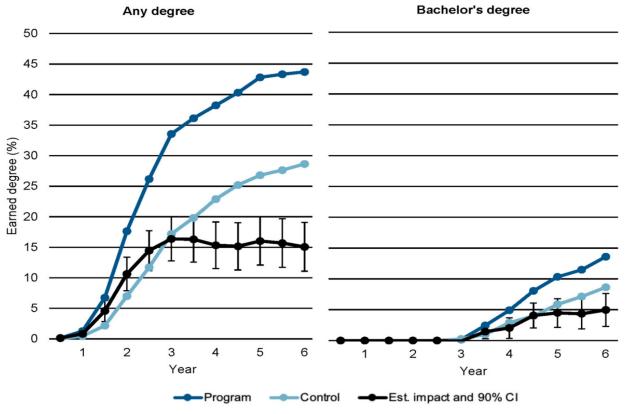

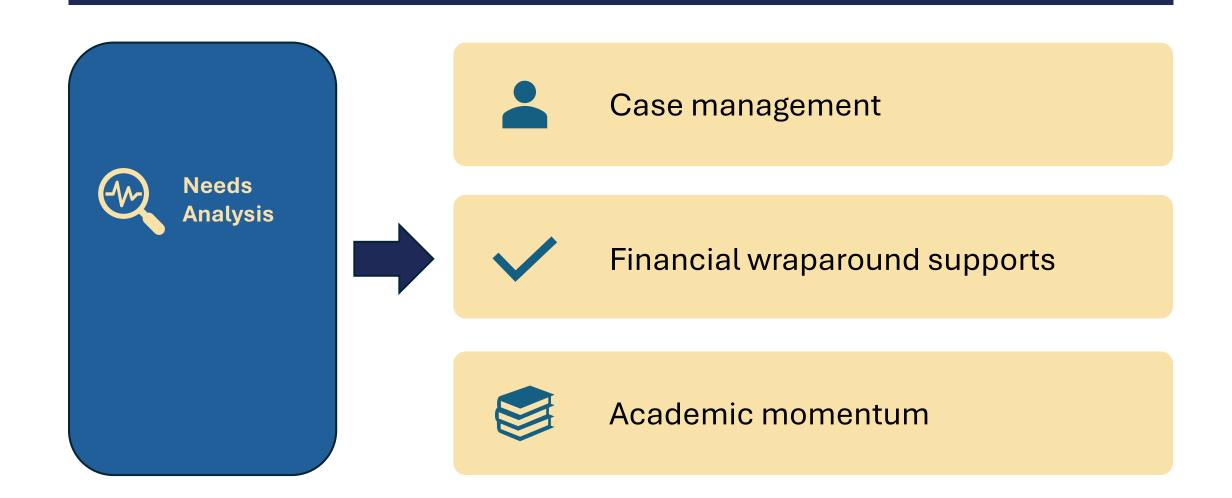
CUNY ASAP/SUNY ACE: "Case Management" Evidence-Based Model

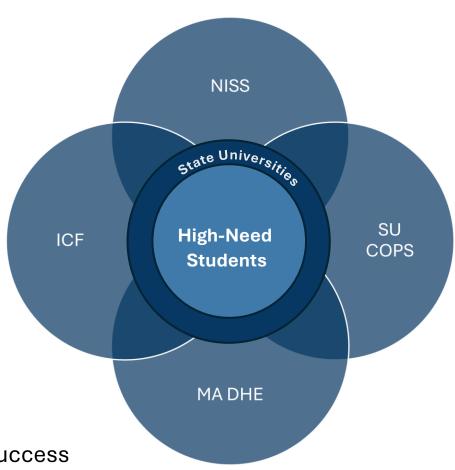

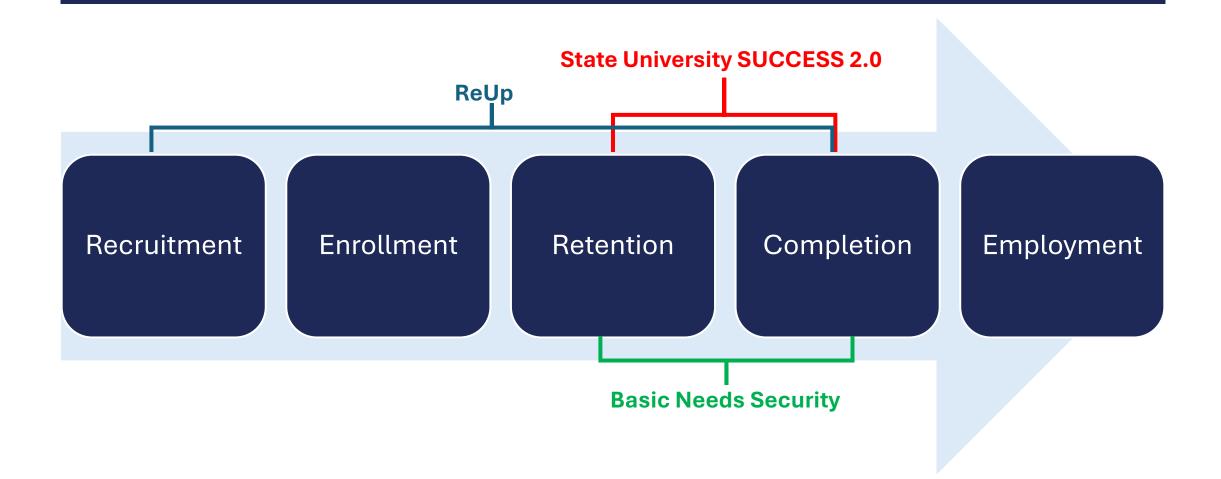

HOPE Center Survey Data

- 73% of students experience at least one form of basic needs insecurity
 - 41% face food insecurity
 - 48% face housing insecurity
- 57% of students stopped out due to mental health issues
- 48% of students were unaware of resources available to them

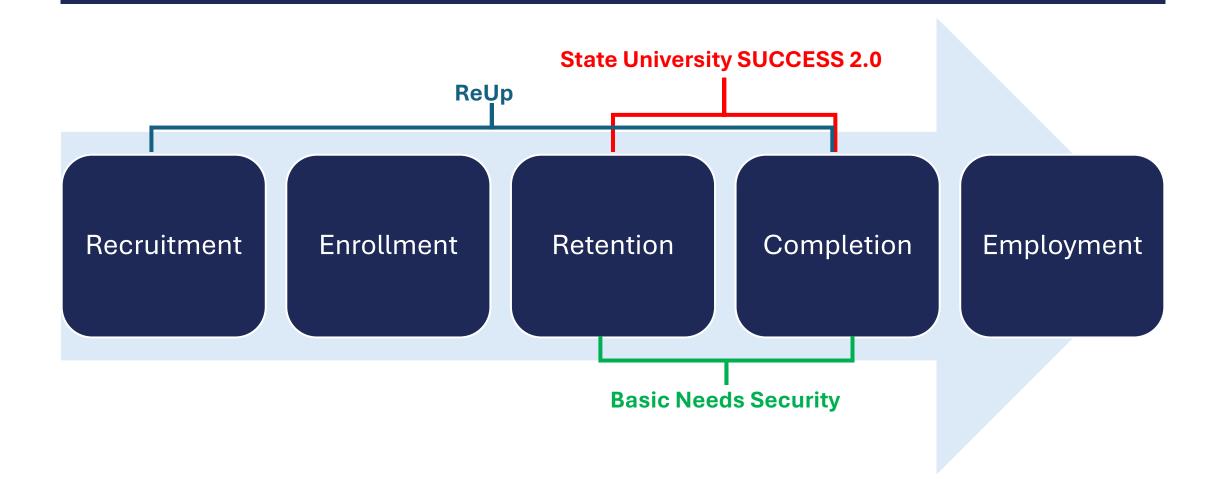

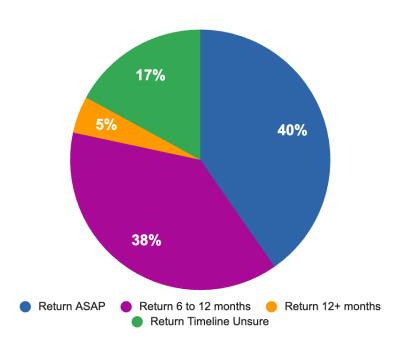

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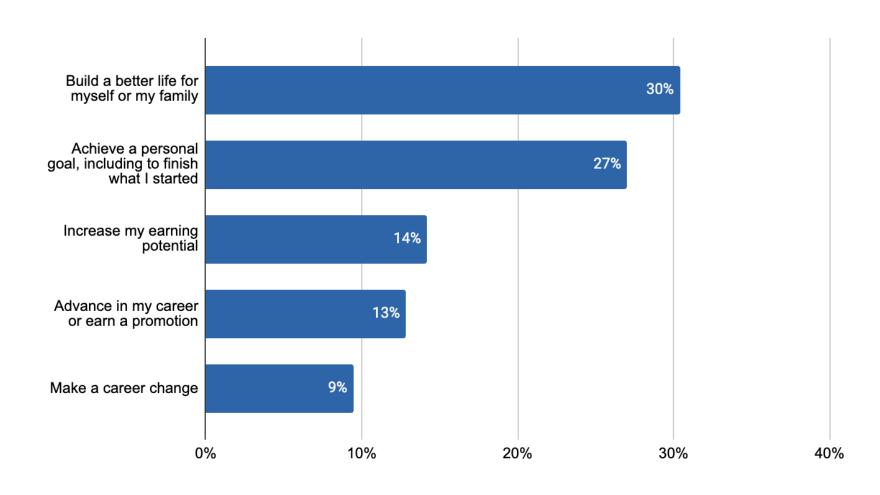

Expected Timeline To Return

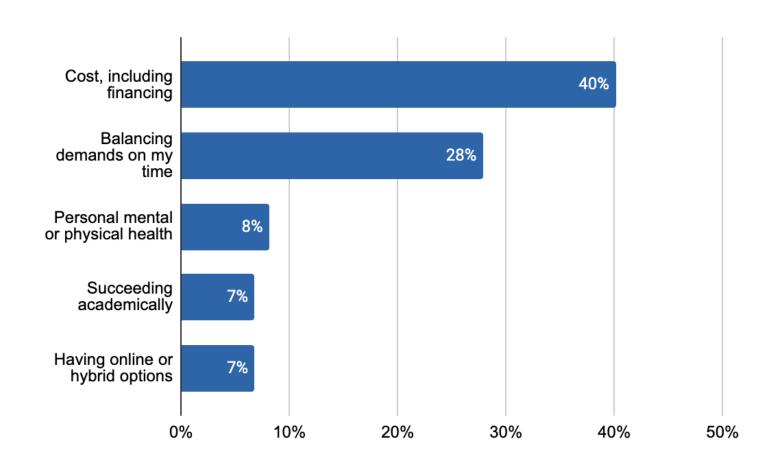
