
Strategic Higher Education Finance (SHEF) Framework

- SUCCESS: Designated in the budget "to improve outcomes for their most vulnerable populations including, but not limited to, lowincome, first-generation, minority and disabled students and lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning students."

Committees and Commissions

Commission on Higher Education Quality and Affordability (CHEQA)

• Chapter 140 of the Acts of 2024, section 215, as enacted, states:

"The board of higher education shall convene a task force to study and make recommendations on improving quality and affordability of higher education in the Commonwealth, including state financial assistance programs for students domiciled in the Commonwealth and attending the University of Massachusetts segment or the state university segment." CHEQA's Legislatively-Mandated Topic Areas **State assistance programs,** including state aid for tuition, fees, books, supplies and other **costs of attendance**.

<u>Student costs and debts</u> associated with postsecondary education enrolment.

Programs that improve student success, including, but not limited to, academic support, career counselling, and assistance with applying for state and federal benefits and improvements to facilities.

Improvements needed to increase the <u>recruitment and retention</u> of qualified adjunct and full-time <u>faculty and staff</u>.

Financial assistance program design and models to efficiently increase state assistance, improve outcomes, and reduce student costs.



Advisory Council to Advance Representation in Education (ACARE)

Recommendations in Five Key Areas (ACARE, October 16, 2024):

- 2) Re-engaging Adult Learners and Encourage Participation in Higher Education;
- 3) Implementing Innovative Recruitment, Admissions and Enrollment Policies;
- 4) Improving Equity in Financial Aid;
- 5) Increasing Persistence and Completion for Historically Underserved Students.
