FRAMINGHAM STATE UNIVERSITY WARREN BARN PROJECT MSCBA PROJECT NO. XXXX-XXX-XX

Project Description

Framingham State University (FSU), the Authority and the Town of Ashland, Massachusetts (Ashland) have developed a Memorandum of Agreement (Attachment A) for the purpose of construction of a replica of the Henry E. Warren Barn to be used as an expansion of the existing Warren Conference Center (WCC) owned by the Authority on behalf of FSU.

The Project will be used as an event hosting facility for the FSU faculty, staff and students, the Town of Ashland and the general public. As an event hosting facility, the Project will support FSU's academic programming (particularly through expansion of opportunities available to the University's' Hospitality Management Program), social programming (including FSU events and University Community Club activities), and recreational (including FSU residence hall residents use).

Associated ancillary and parking facilities, if any, may contain space for retail food service and other retail and commercial purposes, non-profit and/or governmental uses (any of which uses and the operation and maintenance of all or any part of which facility may be pursuant to one or more leases or other contractual arrangements with appropriate persons or entities including persons or entities engaged in for-profit enterprises).

In order to the complete the Project, Ashland will enter into a long-term lease, for the parcel located at 517 Chestnut Street, Ashland, MA, with the Authority that, in turn, will enter into a Management Services Agreement with FSU to assign property management responsibility to FSU or a third party designated by FSU.

FSU is requesting a determination by the Board that the use of the facility as contemplated in the attached Memorandum of Agreement furthers the purposes of FSU and initiation of a request to the Authority to undertake such Project.
