## **Background**

Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 15A, Section 9(i) provides that the Board of Higher Education shall annually set tuition rates for the State Universities and the Community Colleges. The recommendation is for all FY2027 tuition rates to remain the same as the current tuition rates.

Tuition and fee-setting guidelines for the Massachusetts College of Art and Design and Massachusetts Maritime Academy are outlined in their BHE-approved partnership plans with the Commonwealth. Under the partnership plans, tuition rates are set by the board of trustees of each institution and revenue is retained by the campus. Pursuant to Section 7 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws, any material change to the five-year plans as approved by the Board, including any change to the projection for total student charges, shall require approval of that change by the BHE. Proposed student charges for FY2026 at both institutions were reviewed by Board staff and are within the projections outlined in their respective five-year plans; action by the Board, therefore, is not required.
