Neil Swidey is a narrative nonfiction author and journalist. His most recent book, Trapped Under the Sea, was a No. 1 Boston Globe bestseller that was named one of the best books of 2014 by Amazon and *Booklist*. His first book, The Assist, which focused on urban education, was a Boston Globe bestseller that was named one of the best books of 2008 by the Washington Post. He was also a coauthor of the New York Times bestselling Last Lion: The Fall and Rise of Ted Kennedy. A staff writer for the Boston Globe Magazine, Neil writes about a wide range of topics and subcultures, but returns often to education, most recently doing an in-depth examination of the college debt burden faced by low-income, first-generation students. His writing has won numerous national awards and been featured in The Best American Science Writing, The Best American Crime Writing, and The Best American Political Writing. As an outgrowth of his first book, he founded the Alray Scholars Program, a mentoring and scholarship nonprofit that helps give Boston students a second chance at college.


