Tuition Equity Law Overview (DHE Legal)

Tuition Equity Law* Summary

- Signed into law August 10, 2023 (FY24 Budget),
 retroactively effective July 1, 2023
- Established a new "High School Completer" pathway for state financial aid:
 - a new, additional authorized eligibility status for all students including some non-US citizens, namely undocumented students, to establish "residency" for state higher ed benefits.
- Expanded access to
 - in-state tuition at MA public institutions and
 - all state financial aid programs at MA public or private institutions

Tuition Equity Law Overview (DHE Legal)

Who is a "High School Completer?"

- To qualify as a "High School Completer," a studentapplicant must have:
 - attended high school in the Commonwealth for at least three (3)
 years*; and
 - earned a diploma or the equivalent (a GED/ HiSet) in the Commonwealth; and
 - met other documentation requirements (next slide)

The student's three years of high school attendance at a Massachusetts high school (public or private) do not need to be consecutive and may have occurred at any time. As such, a student-applicant who, for example, enrolled late (e.g., during sophomore year of high school) and graduates, or alternatively who is enrolled for three years but drops out early (e.g., during junior or senior years) but ultimately obtains a high school diploma equivalent, may be eligible under the High School Completer pathway.

^{*}The student is required to complete at least three years of high school (9th-12th grade) in Massachusetts. Any combination of three years of enrollment is acceptable. The school may be public or private but must be physically located within Massachusetts. A student must also have graduated from high school or have received the equivalent of a high school diploma (like a GED).

Tuition Equity Law Implementation (DHE Legal)

Documentation Requirements

- To be eligible a student must provide either:
 - a valid Social Security Number (SSN), or
 - documentation reflecting the issuance of an individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), or
 - documentation of registration with selective service (if applicable) or
 - if the individual is not a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United States, that person must provide a completed <u>DHE Affidavit</u> stating that the individual will file an application to become a citizen or legal permanent resident within 120 days after the individual becomes eligible to do so.

Tuition Equity Law Implementation (DHE Legal)

Tuition Equity Law Form and Affidavit

- Objective for Administrators: affidavit facilitates intake of student aid applications and assessment of student-applicant eligibility
- Objective for Students & Families: affidavit fulfills statutory documentation requirement for High School Completer Status if student does not have SSN or taxpayer ID (ITIN)
- Affidavit allows student to attest to requirements for High School Completer status, including that:
 - the student will apply for citizenship or legal permanent residence status within 120 days of eligibility for that status, as required by statute for students without a social security number or an ITIN number.
- Note that students no longer need to show proof of selective service filing if eligible, per the legislation.



MASFA – MASSAid Platform

- GOAL: create a more seamless experience for students and institutions
- MASFA applicants will benefit by having access to all MASSAid student portal features, including the ability to view all available aid programs, for which they may be eligible.
- This transition will centralize and streamline access for financial aid administrators and allow institutions to draw data from MASSAid for both MASFA and FAFSA applicants without having to access additional external portals.
- 2026-2027 application will be released November 24, 2025
 - MASSGrant priority deadline must file MASFA by May 1, 2026
 - Current 25-26 MASFA applicants will receive a notification regarding the release of the 26-27 MASFA

MASFA – MASSAid Platform

- Students will access the 2026-2027 MASFA application via a specific link located on the OSFA/DHE website.
 - Student will need to complete the FAFSA/MASFA Eligibility Questionnaire to determine if they
 are eligible to file the MASFA and receive the link to create an account/view the application
 - IMPORTANT: students should **not** create an account on the general MASSAid portal to try to access the application (it is not accessible that way)
- Application will be available in English and Spanish
 - Must select Spanish option **prior** to starting the application in order to view it in Spanish
- Parents will not need to create an account or sign the application.
 - Student will be responsible for providing all parent information on the application
- Students who need to finish incomplete MASFA application will be able to login to the student portal to finish application
- Students will not be able to make changes or updates to their application once it has been signed and submitted
 - All subsequent corrections/updates to a student's application are restricted to OSFA agency users, once the Student Aid Index (SAI) is determined


